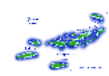

The only Virgin Island to be the result of tectonic uplifting of a coral bed, Anegada remains all but invisible until the trees and boats start to show themselves a few miles out, while the tall, green hills of the rest of the Virgins are always visible behind you. This sneaky profile, along with the huge reef that surrounds Anegada, making it all but unapproachable except for the southwest corner, makes this island off limits for most bareboat charterers.
